2. I submitted the signed iWorQs agreement and Maureen and I are working closely with them to integrate our information into their system. We are meeting weekly with them and corresponding via email in between, working to getting the system up and running.

3. The Architectural Review Board Monday August 2, 2021. The only item on the agenda was the demolition of the concrete stadium bleachers at Baird Mitchell field. While approval was granted the Architectural review board had reservations concerning lead abatement/containment. I have worked closely with the general contractor Murphy construction, the sub-contractor Pro Quality Demolition and although asbestos testing was done neither the Ohio EPA or Ohio Dept. of Health required any lead testing/containment other than standard demolition protocols consisting mainly of ensuring "wetting down" of the work area as needed to control dust. While equipment is on site if needed the rain has provided more than enough water to keep the dust down. Discussions have been had to bolster our code to possibly require some procedures/documentation be provided in order to obtain a demolition permit. The next Architectural Review Board is scheduled for Monday September 13, 2021 (moved from first Monday due to Labor Day holiday) at 7:30 PM at village hall with discussion beginning at 7.

4. The Planning Commission meeting for tomorrow Wednesday August 18, 2021 was cancelled due to chair being unable to attend. A replat of the Mort property on Water St. has been submitted. I will also have an amended version of 1278 for their consideration prohibiting the use of gravel as an approved substrate for parking areas in view of the street as well as a "tightening" of the language for allowable parking areas that will allow common usage but allow easier enforcement for problem situations.

5. Code Enforcement
The new village code enforcement line is now in service. All calls/concerns relating to code violations or property complaints from residents can be directed to (330)506-4748. All residential and commercial permitting, Architectural Review Board submissions, Variance or Conditional Use Applications, Replats, and Board of Zoning Appeals issues should still be directed to me at village hall or my cell.

6. I forwarded the Dominion gas upgrade project to Gary Diorio at solicitor's request. They are abandoning a leaking line by the pedestrian bridge on Water Street and will be reworking tie ins

and partial line replacements along Water street by Second street and several areas including 224 and 170. The current plan has multiple locations of digging up the newly paved Main Street which is the greatest concern.

Dear Ali,

Russ Beatty and I visited the following locations today to review recent flooding:

1. **Sheridan Road near the ballfields.** This area receives storm water flow from the north and also from the south along Sheridan Road. This part of Sheridan Road is the "bottom of the bowl". The storm sewer piping system that leaves this area and connects to the storm sewer system to the west into Boardman Township is not designed to collect and transport storm water runoff from high intensity storms that our area experienced recently. To solve this problem, Boardman Township (along with the ABC Water District) would have to study the sub-watershed of Alverne Drive, Canavan, and the other streets in that area to determine the potential for storm water detention basins and/or increasing the size of the storm sewers in this area. In Boardman Township, the ABC Water District has found that it is more cost effective to purchase homes at locations of chronic flooding than to replace or enlarge the storm sewers in the flood-prone areas. The installation of larger or more catch basins along Sheridan Road by the Village will not solve the flooding problem. The storm sewer system leaving the Sheridan Road area would have to be upgraded beginning at the discharge point of this sub-watershed west into Boardman Township.
2. **Resident at the northwest corner of Johnston Place and Alverne.** Over the years, the property owner at this location was concerned with storm water runoff from the narrow section of Alverne flowing down his driveway into the garage area of his home. The drive slopes away from the street and downhill toward the home. The garage is in the basement area of the home. I knew of the resident's concerns so last year during the 2020 paving program, I worked with the Contractor to re-profile the narrow section of Alverne so the storm water runoff flows away from his driveway approach. Now, the only water that flows to the home would be what lands on the driveway and yard and flows naturally downhill toward the home. The Village has done everything they can to help this situation. In addition, the storm sewer collection system in this part of Johnston Place and Alverne also flow toward the west into Boardman Township. The existing storm sewer collection system does not have the capacity to handle the high-intensity storms that recently occurred as discussed above in No. 1. If Johnston Place and yards were flooded, then the downspout drains were also underwater and sump pumps in the homes along Johnston Place could not keep up with the storm intensity. Following the end of the storm event, the flooding water receded quickly off the streets and yards and drained properly into the Boardman Township area.

On behalf of the Village, I could contact Boardman Township to discuss these flooding areas to determine any next steps. Please let me know. Thanks.
